Joy in Jesus Christ Living the Sanctified Life: Introduction Philippians 2:12-13

- <u>**Truth**</u>: Living the sanctified life brings great joy to the Christian because it is the goal of salvation to be more like Jesus.
  - 2 Timothy 3:16-17
  - Contradiction: a statement or proposition that denies itself or another statement and is logically incongruous; inconsistent; incompatible; conflicting.
  - Paradox: a statement or proposition that <u>seems</u> selfcontradictory or absurd but in reality expresses God's truth.
  - Justified: a legal term in which God declares a person forgiven of all sin and is righteous before Him; salvation.
  - Romans 5:1-2
  - Sanctification: the progressive work of God and man that makes us less like our sinful self and more like Jesus Christ in our daily life.
- 1. The issue with sanctification.

"Christians are happy to live <u>with</u> Jesus in the next life, but not so happy in living <u>for</u> Jesus in this life."

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- 2. Three stages in sanctification.
  - When sanctification begins.
  - How sanctification develops.
  - The two-fold completion of sanctification.
- 3. Motives for living the sanctified life.
  - Our love for Jesus (John 14:15,21).
  - To have a clear conscience before God (1 Timothy 1:5-6; 1 Peter 3:15-16).
  - To be an effective instrument in bringing honor and glory to Jesus Christ and His Kingdom (2 Timothy 2:20-21).
  - To see non-Christians come to faith in Jesus Christ through our witness (1 Peter 3:1-2,15-16).
  - To receive the continued blessing of the Lord in our life and work (1 Peter 3:8-9).
  - The desire to avoid God's displeasure and chastisement in life (1 Peter 1:13-17).
  - The desire to receive a greater heavenly reward (Matthew 6:19-21).
  - The desire for a closer walk with Jesus in this life (Galatians 5:16-18).
  - The desire for peace in our life (Isaiah 26:3-4).
  - The desire to do what God commands because His commands are right (Psalm 40:8).
